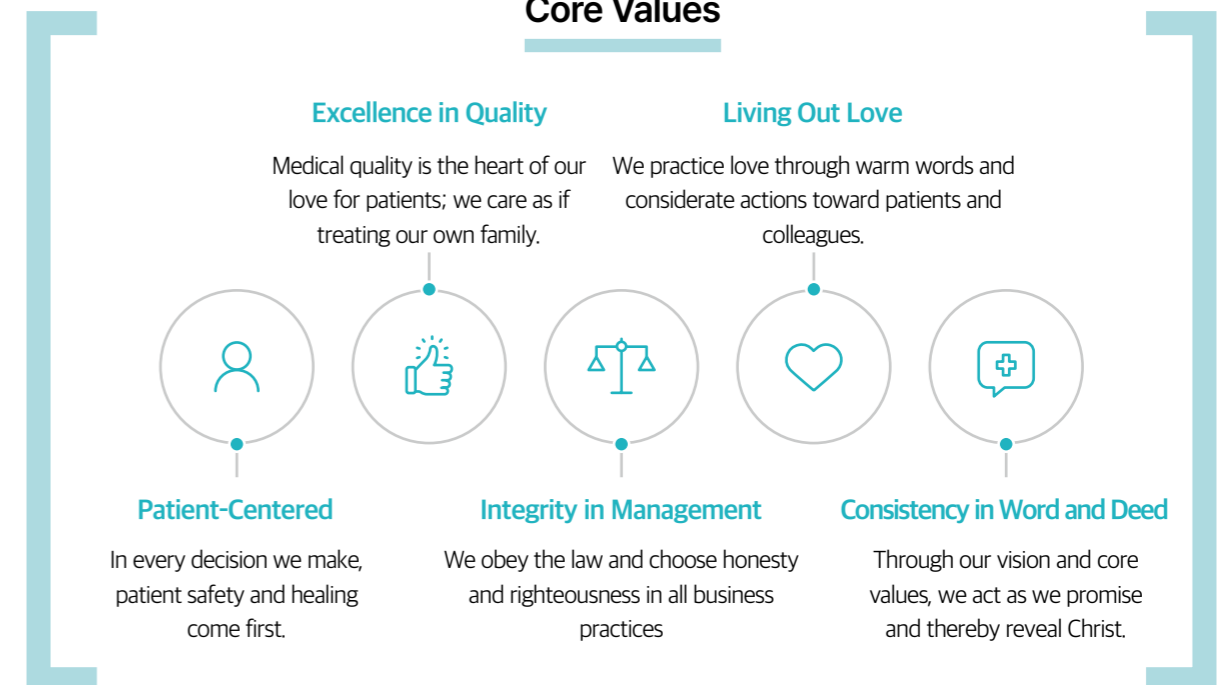

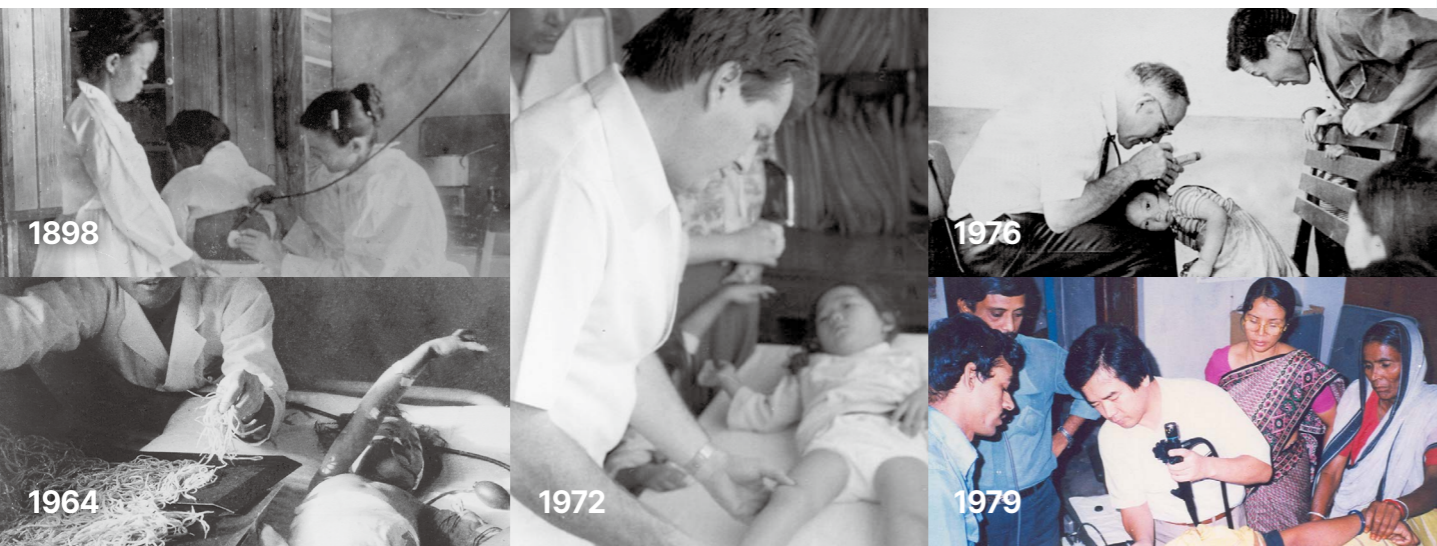

The hospital with the most 'firsts,' we will move forward with the name of 'the best.'



- 1898** ○ Founder Dr. Mattie Ingold began medical practice
Established as the first private medical missionary hospital in Korea and the first modern medical institution in the Honam region
- 1909** ○ Under the 2nd director, Dr. Forsythe, initiated the first treatment of Hansen's disease in Korea
- 1930** ○ Under Director Dr. Boggs, introduced and operated the first X-ray diagnostic equipment in Korea
- 1949** ○ Introduced the nation's first structured residency training system
- 1950** ○ Founded the affiliated Nursing School
Designated as a frontline military hospital during the Korean War
- 1955** ○ Pioneered the first deep therapy for cancer patients in Korea
- 1961** ○ Established an independent oncology clinic
- 1963** ○ Initiated the first national cancer registry project in Korea
- 1964** ○ Led the first nationwide campaign for parasite eradication
- 1965** ○ Introduced private health insurance to reduce inpatients' financial burden
- 1967** ○ Received government approval to establish an independent foundation (PMC Maintenance Foundation)
- 1972** ○ Missionary Dr. John Suh introduced the first surgical fixation techniques and the use of halo braces in Korea
Performed the first limb lengthening surgery and reconstructive hand surgery for quadriplegic patients in Korea

- 1979** ○ Began the first full-scale international medical mission from Korea

David John Seel Memorial Cancer Center

Since 1955, Presbyterian Medical Center has pioneered Korea's first radiation oncology treatment and cancer registry program. Today, it is recognized as the leading hospital for cancer surgery outcomes in the Honam region.



Emergency Medical Center

Staffed with experienced emergency medicine specialists, the center operates a nationwide top-3, and Jeonbuk's largest, emergency facility, providing rapid initial treatment and an integrated emergency care system.



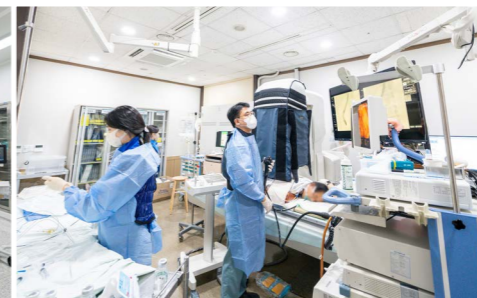
Rehabilitation Center

In 1974, PMC established Korea's first rehabilitation ward. Now housed in a six-story Rehabilitation Center, it offers personalized one-on-one rehabilitation programs supported by advanced rehabilitation equipment to restore patients' functional abilities.



Intervention Center

The first in Korea to introduce in-operating room 3D biplane angiography equipment and a multidisciplinary cooperative system, ensuring outstanding surgical safety and precision.



Gastroenterology Center

Equipped with state-of-the-art endoscopy and ultrasound devices, the center is staffed by experienced gastroenterology endoscopists and dedicated nurses, achieving high treatment success rates for gastrointestinal cancers.



Artificial Kidney Center

The first of its kind in the Honam region, PMC's Artificial Kidney Center operates 67 advanced hemodiafiltration machines. Specialists and skilled nursing teams provide safe and comfortable dialysis care.

PMC boasts nation-leading expertise in emergency coronary intervention, reopening blocked arteries within 90 minutes of arrival. The center is also a certified facility for minimally invasive aortic valve replacement surgery, enabling faster, safer recovery.

JESUS Brain Aneurysm Center (JBAC)

PMC's Brain Aneurysm Center was founded as a comprehensive response to the increasing burden of cerebrovascular diseases. The center's top specialists developed a specialized aneurysm screening set and a treatment flow chart tailored to patient needs. Through its one-stop brain aneurysm screening system, patients can complete blood tests, examinations, and receive results with speed and accuracy. Equipped with a hybrid operating room combining angiography and surgery, the center ensures the highest level of care for protecting the community's brain health.

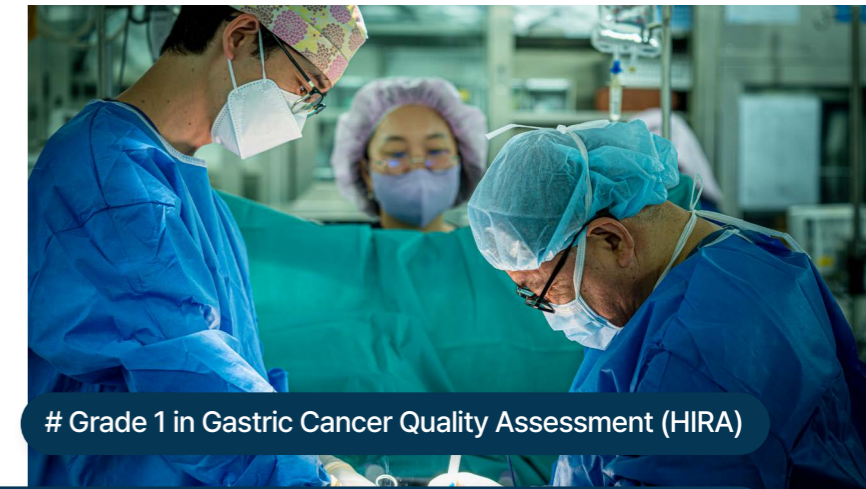

For early-stage cancer lesions, we provide advanced endoscopic treatments, while for progressive cancers requiring surgery, we offer minimally invasive laparoscopic procedures. For patients who cannot undergo surgery, our interventional treatments and stent placements are recognized as the best in the country, helping to shorten hospitalization and recovery times, and allowing patients to return to daily life sooner, enhancing both satisfaction and quality of life. Through collaborative, patient-centered care led by specialists with extensive clinical experience, we ensure a seamless approach from diagnosis to treatment.

The medical team at Presbyterian Medical Center's Gastrointestinal Endoscopy Center, drawing on extensive procedural experience, was the first in the world to report the effectiveness of open peroral endoscopic myotomy (POEM). They also pioneered and reported the subserosal dissection technique for gastric subepithelial tumors, establishing the center as Korea's leading training and treatment hub for advanced therapeutic endoscopy and demonstrating that PMC's endoscopic treatment standards are world-class.



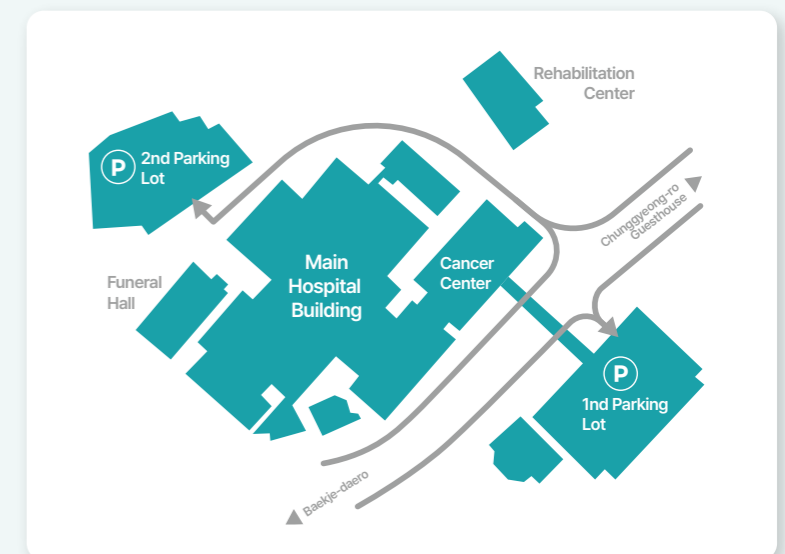

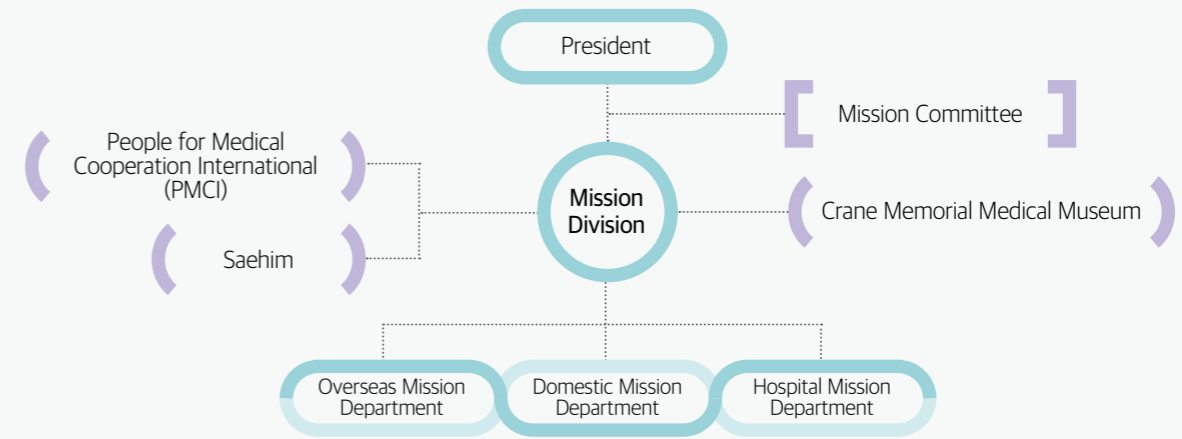

Now, we aim to spread that love to our neighbors and to the world, fulfilling our vision of becoming a mission hub hospital.



Overseas Mission Department



Support for Overseas Missionaries and Mission Hospitals

We collaborate with 13 medical missionaries across six countries worldwide. In addition, we support Karamtola Hospital in Bangladesh and six other domestic mission hospitals under the Korea Overseas Medical Mission Society (KOMMS).

Medical Assistance for Overseas Missionaries and Foreign Nationals

We provide medical support, including health screenings and treatment, for returning overseas missionaries and foreign visitors.

Training Programs for International Medical Staff

We invite medical professionals from developing countries for specialized training and capacity-building programs.

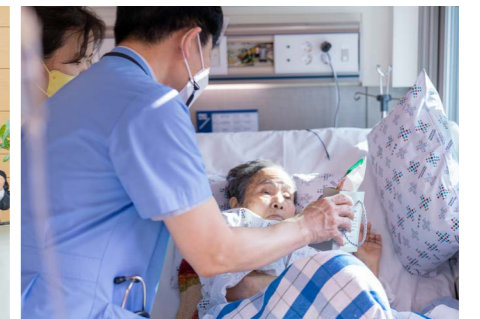

The First Museum Established by a Private Medical Institution in Korea Crane Memorial Medical Museum

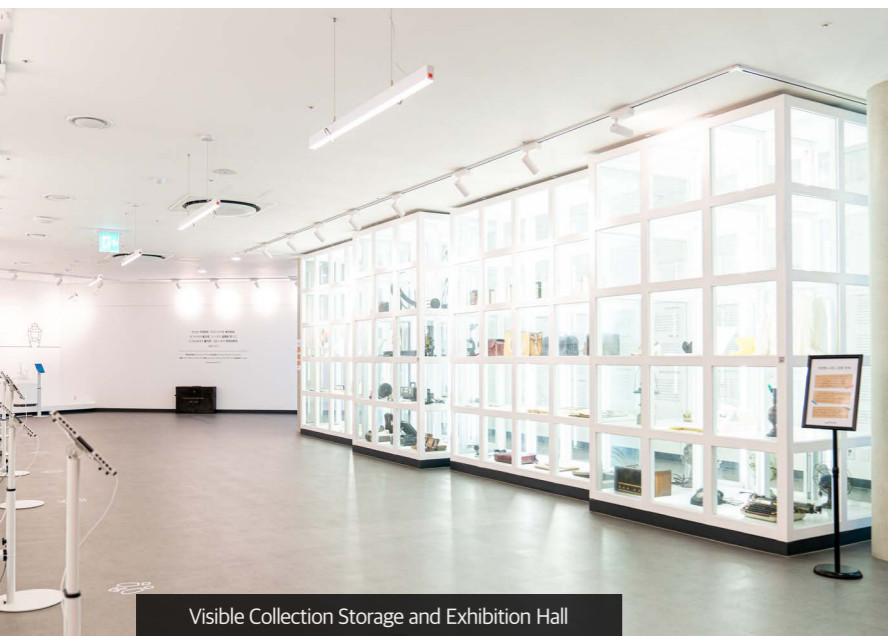

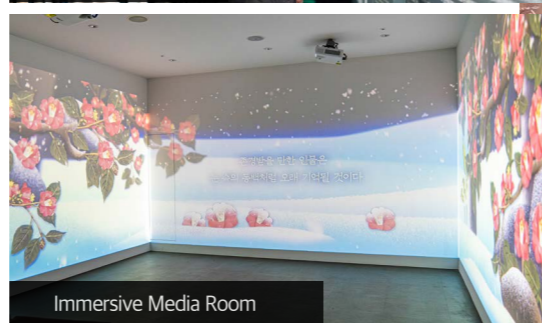
